Adolescents and Young Adults

- 'Stress levels perceived to be healthy' :
 - teens reporting higher stress levels than adults
- Stress -> feeling : **overwhelmed** 31%

depressed or sad - 30%

- Stress impacting their lives:
 - teens 54% vs adults 39%

Adolescents and Young Adults

- Sandwiched between childhood and adulthood
- Developmental tasks are complex layered on continued physical and cognitive growth
 - issues of self-identity, body image
 - evolving intimacy, relationships, sexuality
 - evolving interdependence (dependence-independence-interdependence)
 - redefinition of roles in family, among peers, in society, career

Challenges with acquired illness

- Progress in illness -> children living past 21st birthday
 - median life expectancy increasing...
 - eg. cystic fibrosis = **36.8years**

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• congenital heart diseases = 75 +/-11 years (smoking, illicit drugs, oral

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hygiene)

The gaps in palliative care for AYA



- Evolving cognitive, psychological, social, and spiritual development on each domain
- Strategies utilized for children or adults often miss the complex needs

Challenges with acquired illness

- Need for privacy and autonomy -> invasive procedures, hospitalizations and increased reliance on parents
- Development of self-esteem and positive body image -> amputation, hair loss, and weight loss or weight gain
- Develop independence, peer relations and sexual identity -> limited/ prevented from achieving these milestones, uncertainty

Challenges and Opportunities for Palliative Care : Physical Domain - symptom management

 symptoms at EOL - more severe (several disease models)

- needs higher doses and adjuvants, frequent assessment and rapid titration
- maintain independence foregoing debilitating side effects of treatments
- non-pharmacological modalities

 Total suffering worsened : psychological & spiritual developmental tasks with physical symptoms



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Challenges and Opportunities for Palliative Care : Physical Domain - body image

 peak reproductive and sexual years, growth velocity

 Illness: delay/alteration -> demoralizing actively address threats to hormonal, sexual and reproductive health

self identity is rooted in physical growth

anticipated physical changes



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Challenges and Opportunities for Palliative Care : Cognitive Domain - decision-making

- prefrontal cortex : skills in calibration of risk and reward, problem solving, prioritizing, planning, self-evaluation, and regulation of emotions
- Illness complex medical decision making -> regression to more concrete or child-like thinking
- -> unable to cope with uncertainty and assess treatment options

- foster independent thinking, assurance they are not alone
- formation and maintenance of ACP
- anticipated fluctuations in goals of care (parents have poor understanding of AYA's values)

Challenges and Opportunities for Palliative Care : ethical and legal

- lack legal authority to make binding medical decisions (eg. discontinuation of treatment)
- shared decision-making model -> help with clinical uncertainty and nonadherence
- functional criteria for having capacity -> consider to allow young adolescent's treatment preferences

Challenges and Opportunities for Palliative Care : psychological

illness-> isolation from peers, cope
with complex emotions, coping with
uncertainty, a sense of little to no
control

 taking risks can be positively associated with increased levels of independence, responsibility and autonomy

ask for reasons for risk-taking
behaviour - provide clear
assignment of responsibilities and
consequences

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Challenges and Opportunities for Palliative Care : Social

- disclosure of illness and the uncertainty of response = threaten to developing self-identity
- who is of social importance can vary and change over time

- provide 'stock' answers for disclosure
- ascertain permission to communicate to family members , set expectations for dr-pt confidentiality
- develop healthy coping skills to reduce high risk behaviour
- protective factors: cohesive family, good role models, spiritual strength

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Challenges for Palliative Care : Spiritual Domain

- struggle with defining personal spiritual and religious beliefs and practices
- religious practice less important
- illness-> face own mortality
- if 'acting out' consider existential crisis

- facilitate conversations to define/ conceptualize personal spiritual beliefs and practices
- assist their struggle with personal death awareness
- identifies fears

Challenges from Health care systems

- Paediatric and Adult services binary health care system
- Training : discrete adult-oriented or child-oriented programmes

Challenges from Health care systems

- AYA : need developmentally appropriate care
- Transition care : address gap in the medical continuum

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• Referral for PC: during the last month of life : 7-17%,

last day of life : 18%, no palliative care referral : 43%

Adolescent : person aged 10-19yo Young adolescents : children aged 10-15yo Child : birth to 15yo Young people : 10-24yo most publications in Nth America AYA : 15-39yo

Research : perdominantly cancer, 18% on non-malignant
