- Palliative care for children is the active total care of the child's body, mind, and spirit and also involves giving support to the family.
- It begins when illness is diagnosed and continues regardless of whether a child receives treatment directed at the disease.
- Health providers must evaluate and alleviate a child's physical, psychologic, and social distress.
- Effective palliative care requires a broad multidisciplinary approach that includes the family and makes use of available community resources; it can be successfully implemented even if resources are limited.
- It can be provided in tertiary care facilities, in community health centers, and even in children's homes.

• AF, girl, 2 year 6 month old.

#### • Symptoms:

- Fever and the gum bleeds for 1 week before the mother took her to the hospital in Anambas Island. Mother also noticed that her daughter also looked pale 1 day before she took her to the hospital.

#### Physical Examination:

- She looked weak, body temperature > 38°C, conjunctiva was pale, gum bleeds, and petechiae all over her body.

#### Laboratory Examination:

- Hb : 2,8 g/dl

- WBC : 53.2000 /ul

- Platelets : 12.000/ul

#### Working Diagnosis:

Suspect Leukemia with
 Bi-cytopenia and Leukocytosis





## **Physical**

#### Their plan

- Antipyretic & Antibiotic.
- Oxygen.
- Transfusion (PRC & Platelet).
- Hydration.



#### Reality

They cannot performed transfusion.

 So they decide to refer this patient to Batam Island by boat that takes around 8 hours. The schedule for the boat is only on Wednesday and Sunday.


## **Psychological**

 Mother is a single parent. She's very afraid and panic because she had to take care her little girl by her self.




 Mother and her girl accompanied by 1 doctor and 1 nurse to go to Batam Island.

• Is the girl going to make it to Batam Island?




#### Reality

 The doctor in Anambas Island said to the girl's mother: "At least we do something for your girl. She will make it or not, we leave it to God. But yes, she has the possibility to die on the way to Batam Island. She can passed away because her heart will stop suddenly or because of bleeding".

### Social

## Question that came up concerning this aspect

 Where are they going to stay in Batam Island? Impossible to go from Anambas Island to Batam Island, back and forth.



#### Reality

- They have family in Batam Island and they will stay there during the chemotherapy.
- For medication, they use the government insurance that cover all of the expenses.
- This little girl has a twin sister back home in Anambas Island live with her auntie.

## Spiritual

#### What about it?

• The girl's family is a Moslem family.



#### Reality


 I ask the doctors and nurses that take care of this girl to remind the family to pray and we can invite the ustad to visit her and her mother to give them support.

## What happened when they reach Batam Island?

- They departed at 07.00 and arrived around 16.00 because of the bad weather and go straight to Awal Bros Hospital in Batam Island.
- I asked my colleague to performed complete blood count and ask the pathologist to see whether the morphology of the leucocyte is more likely to ALL or AML. I do this because I cannot do the bone marrow aspiration right away.
- As the result came out and its ALL, so I asked my colleague to start the chemotherapy right away.

Osteosarcoma spread to the lung


#### Symptoms:


Anger, Often cry, Withdraw from her friends, Focus on her self, Difficult to sleep

#### Cause of the suffering: Pain, Unfulfilled wishes











#### Approach:

Pain Management: intra-arterial chemotherapy, Give her a space, Give the information that she need, Involved her in decision making, Create a nuance of a place that she wants to be in her room.

- Is the child's condition reversible?
- By taking the child to a hospital, will it prolonged his or her life?
- Is the child will get a good care in the hospital?
- What is actually the child want?
- What is actually the family want?

- Pediatric Palliative Care is not a matter that your patient is going to die or not. The point is that we take good care or our patient the best that we can.
- Pediatric Palliative Care is when you see a suffering child not only from his or her physic but also psychological, social, and spiritual aspects (Holistic Care).
- Pediatric Palliative Care is not about right or wrong. There is no such thing as right or wrong in Pediatric Palliative Care.
- Pediatric Palliative Care is when you treat 10 children with individual approach for each children because Pediatric Palliative care is an art.
